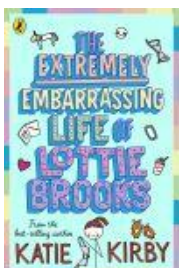


James, Lauren

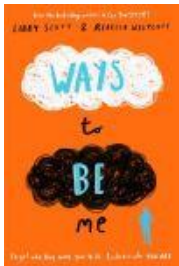


Sarig King, Amy

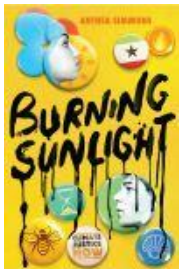

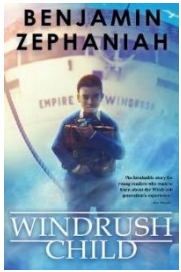


Woltz, Anna
